Every once in a while, someone will ask me why we don't charge our Sh'arim families a tuition that more accurately reflects the cost of educating our kids. Our tuition is very low compared to many congregations, and it has been for as long as I've been here. What an incredible statement we're making! A Jewish future is not about parents providing for their children, it's about a community providing for its children. I love the bumper sticker that says, "If you think education is expensive, try ignorance."

I think about what a congregation is all about. In an article written in 1984, Rabbi Lawrence Kushner wrote, "If synagogues were businesses, their product would be Jews." How do we make Jews? We take the raw material, people with an undeveloped or under developed sense of identity and we fan an ember into a flame. We take people who are seeking something—a connection to God, to a community, or to a people—and we bring them in, welcome them, and nurture them. We take the flame in people whose interest in and love of Judaism has never diminished, and we challenge them to grow even more. We take children, partner with their parents, and educate them—through Sh'arim, our movement's summer programs, and NFTY. And for the young people, what does the finished product look like? There's the rub. There is no finished product.

I recently completed reading a book called A Passion for a People, by Abraham Infeld. Born in South Africa, he was living in this country when he was visited by his father. Upon learning what a funeral home was (Jewish funerals in South Africa were handled by the Chevra Kaddisha, the traditional burial society) the elder Infeld observed that we should change the name from "funeral home" to "Institute of graduation from Jewish education." He commented, perhaps somewhat coarsely, "the only way you can graduate from Jewish education is by dropping dead."

Following this logic, when we bless our confirmands each year at the end of 12th grade, we are sending incomplete products out into the world. What are we hoping for? We're hoping that we've ignited a spark. We've instilled an awareness of home. We provoked curiosity. We've created an insatiable thirst. We've planted a seed. We've conceived lovers of the Jewish people and pursuers of justice. Our forebears named our congregation Shaarai Shomayim, the Gates of Heaven. A few years ago, we renamed our educational program Sh'arim, a word play on Shaarai. We bring our kids to the gates.

In just a few weeks, our Sh'arim year will be over, but between Shaarai Day Camp, and our URJ summer programs, we'll see more than half of our kids continuing their Jewish learning over the summer. Four students, all men this year, will be confirmed at the end of this month before they graduate from high school. We will stay in touch with them in the future, but for now, we've taken them as far as we can. The journey from here is theirs to define. Let's celebrate with them, and let's thank their parents. This is the future of Jewish life. I hope you'll be with us on Friday, May 24th. Our incomplete product is ready for shipping. Let's wrap it in bubble wrap, place it neatly in a secure container, and send it to places still to be determined. Let's send it with joy, and with our blessings. And may we be blessed to be able to watch it bloom.



**On view in the Main Gallery of the Susquehanna Art Museum in Harrisburg now through May 19, 2019**

*Visions of Place* offers a unique lens through which to view and better understand the myriad complexities of Israel. Geography, in all its manifestations—physical, personal, religious, political, historical, economic, and more—remains an inescapable part of Israeli life, psyche, and art. The exhibition includes approximately 50 works, in various and mixed media, by 34 contemporary artists whose contending views of history, culture, and identity cast a revelatory spotlight on modern Israel, while questioning age-old relationships to—and conflicts over—place.

Although focused specifically on Israel, the topics raised by the exhibition have wide interest and applicability in the broader contemporary world. *Visions of Place* demonstrates the richness, complexity, and diversity of the contemporary Israeli art landscape, and by extension,

Israeli society and its place in the world. It provides a thought-provoking artistic experience that catalyzes an important dialogue on the resonant issues illustrated by Israel's contemporary artists in their dynamic exploration of place.
