What is it about Passover that makes it the most widely observed of all holidays?

What brings families together more at Passover than at other times of the year?

What has been an “Egypt” in my life?

How will I know when I’ve arrived?

Will I have the courage to step into the Sea of Reeds if the waters haven’t yet parted?

When will I truly be free?

Will I have the courage of Shifrah and Puah to defy immoral leadership?

Will I recognize a burning bush if I saw one?

Which one of the Four Children am I?

Why do most of us want to think of ourselves as the rebellious or evil child?

What am I willing to risk for my own freedom?

What am I willing to risk to free others?

Am I worthy of being chosen to lead the march to freedom?

Will I get distracted by golden calves that might appear along my way?

When I see my blessings, will I say “Dayenu (it would have been enough),” or will I expect more?

What message will I find in the reawakening of spring?

How will I notice the new growth?

How will I nurture it?

When will I make my pilgrimage to Jerusalem?

What will my offering be?

Ok, maybe I got carried away on the whole Four Questions idea! When people come into contact with Judaism for the first time, some are stymied and some are liberated by the freedom we have to question. Some just want the answers. Others love the choices, the challenge, the debate, the arguing (always respectful, or course). Not only do we permit questioning, we expect it. We enshrine it!

Here’s my ongoing plea, though, as you pursue the answers. Let me join you in that pursuit. I won’t always be able to respond immediately. Please DON’T assume I don’t have the time. (Yes, I know that’s a double negative!) I want to share in your learning. Part of that is a chance to get to know you better. Part of it, truthfully, is how to respectfully help you unlearn what you learned with Rabbi Google as your guide. Being the first google hit doesn’t always mean it’s the most accurate, or the way that we understand it at Shaarai Shomayim. Let’s learn together.

Sign up for our second night seder. Let me know if you’re able to host additional guests at your home seders. Let’s make sure it is a *zissen Pesach* (sweet Passover) and a *Chag Sameach* for everyone.
